

- 1 Anthony Berry (X) of Chipstead, husbandman, sick 15 Apr 1608 (to be buried in the church) to my wife Mary Berry one third of my lands in Chipstead, Ewell and Headley and half wheat at Ewell and Headley and half the summer corn and land called 'Mallows' for 14 years then to my youngest son Richard Berry, she paying 4d p.a. to the lord, also to wife £1 for a year out of a close called 'Ridon' which bounds upon 'Hurst' and is now in the tenure of Roger Weller; while the lease I have demised to James Ham of that field called 'Crouchers' the said Mary my wife to have her third thereof and a third likewise of the common field called Headley Field; to my eldest son Anthony all my freehold land in Ewell and Headley and all my woods etc. growing there and in Chipstead to pay all my debts to James Ham, to Benjamin Bonwicke and John Hillar of Chipstead; to the latter I owe £1 10s which I borrowed and he owes me £2 for keeping his sheep; to my son Richard Berry two acres of freehold land called Mallows Croft paying the lord's rent for the same which is 4d p.a. and the above fourteen years given to his mother being expired; to my son Daniel Berry £10 when he is 21 by my son Anthony; to my wife Mary all my household goods and moveables except as following; to my son Anthony a frame table in the hall and the round table and a framed chair, a great press, chest, a form and a halberd; to my eldest daughter Douglas Berry £10 at her marriage by my son Anthony; to my daughter Mary Berry the chest at my bed's head and £10 at her marriage by son Anthony; to Mary Mose £1 two years after my death; to each godchild 1s; residue to my son Anthony, exec.

Agnes Alderton] 10s at Michaelmas; to Margaret Hardinge wife of Thomas Hardinge my hosts 10s; to Mary Gillam and Joan Mathewe her two maidservants 5s each and to her manservant Richard March 2s; residue to my master Thomas Penfould of Chiddingfold, tanner, exec.
